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


### LIFE Cycle at Worli Sea-Face School

LIFE was able to collaborate with Worli Sea-Face again this month for an important information session with the young women of that school. On the 25<sup>th</sup> of March LIFE in collaboration with the BMC and the Great Indian Dream Foundation hosted a session on sexual health. Now a mandatory session by the BMC. The session is meant to provide the girls with knowledge that will empower them and give them control over their own sexuality.

During the sessions the girls were asked to write a response to two questions. The first question "I am happy I am a girl because..." and a second question "I am not happy I am a girl because..."

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## •Mumbai• **Anganwadis: Positive Feedback**

Over the past month follow up sessions have been held with all Bandra Anganwadi teachers and assistants. These session were held to help judge the effect the previous two sessions: "child rights" and "understanding the needs of children" have had on the Anganwadi system. During the follow up the teachers expressed a certain understanding of the topics which had been presented to them and the importance to their work. This follow up session also gave them the time to review and openly discuss the topics, allowing them to further develop the

Teachers, assistants and supervisors gave positive review of the sessions. Supervisors believe there has been small but significant changes in the functioning of the anganwadis overall. Classes are being taken more regularly, with more regular timings which has in turn allowed more students to attend more regularly leading to an increase in class sizes.

Also this month LIFE distributed toys in the communities of Walmiki Nagar and Dnyaneshwar Nagar.

### **Education Column: Identifying Student Needs**

Recently expert educator Shubhangi Wadekar was interviewed by DNA concerning her recent essav "Identification of Learners' Need and Capacity". In this essay she discusses the need to fill the gap between "what is" and "what should be" in education.

LIFE's newest programs are also working to do this, and are employing several of Wadekar's techniques. LIFE will achieve this by identifying the needs of the learner through diagnostic testing. By identifying the specific needs of the students teachers can address each child's needs more appropriately.

Applying another of Wadekar's techniques LIFE will be working with BMC schools to get parents more involved in the education of their children. LIFE will be doing this by facilitating Parent Teacher Associations to create a greater dialogue between parents and teachers.

Wadekar's words particularly are meaningful to us here at LIFE as we work to close the gap between what is and what should be in BMC education.
