Over 4,000 BEST bus stops are set to be replaced with newly designed shelters

ow that 4,386 Brihanmum-bai Electricity Supply and Transport (BEST) bus shelters and poles in Mumbai are set to be replaced with newly designed shelters that will have stronger rooves and seating facilities, Karmayog, an NGO based at Fort has decided to involve citizens to suggest shifting and re-locating of existing bus shelters to safer and more appropriate locations, so that these can also be incorporated while the changes are being implemented. "Over the last 10 years, there have been so many changes. Roads have widened, malls have come up, schools have opened, etc. Naturally, traffic patterns have also changed and some bus stops are at places which are not so logical today. Also, new traffic lights, new flyovers, one-way streets, road dividers have changed traffic movement in the city. We felt that since BEST will be spending money on replacing bus stops, why not provide our suggestions at the correct time instead of later complaining that a particular bus stop should be relocated?" says Vinay Somani, trustee, Karmayog

Though the BEST readily accept suggestions by residents, strangely, in this case, BEST denies having invited suggestions from the public. Says A S Tamboli, spokesperson, BEST, "We don't know who has been sending these mails. We will investigate and look into the matter." General manager, Uttam Khobragade, was unavailable for comment.

Considering that the common man utilises these services every day, it seems logical that their suggestions should be taken into con-sideration. Says Somani, "BEST authorities have given us a verbal approval that they will incorporate the changes as far as possible. Of course, it will involve coordination with the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai (MCGM), BEST and the traffic police. It would be ideal if the BEST incorporated suggestions from conductors and BEST drivers, since they would be the perfect people for feedback. Unfortunately, I don't think they are encouraged to give feedback. Anyway, we as residents can do our bit. The timing is perfect since BEST is anyway going to spend money on the bustops. There are two adjacent bus stops for residents of Govt. Colony and Lala Lajpatral college students, which are very convenient. However, after the road was widened, one side of the road has 3 lanes while the other has almost 5 lanes now. Also since this is

a long stretch along the Haji Ali sea face, most cars race at a very high speed. As a result, it becomes extremely difficult to cross over and make use of the bus stop. To add to that, the pedestrian traffic signal stops working after 6.30 pm. 
