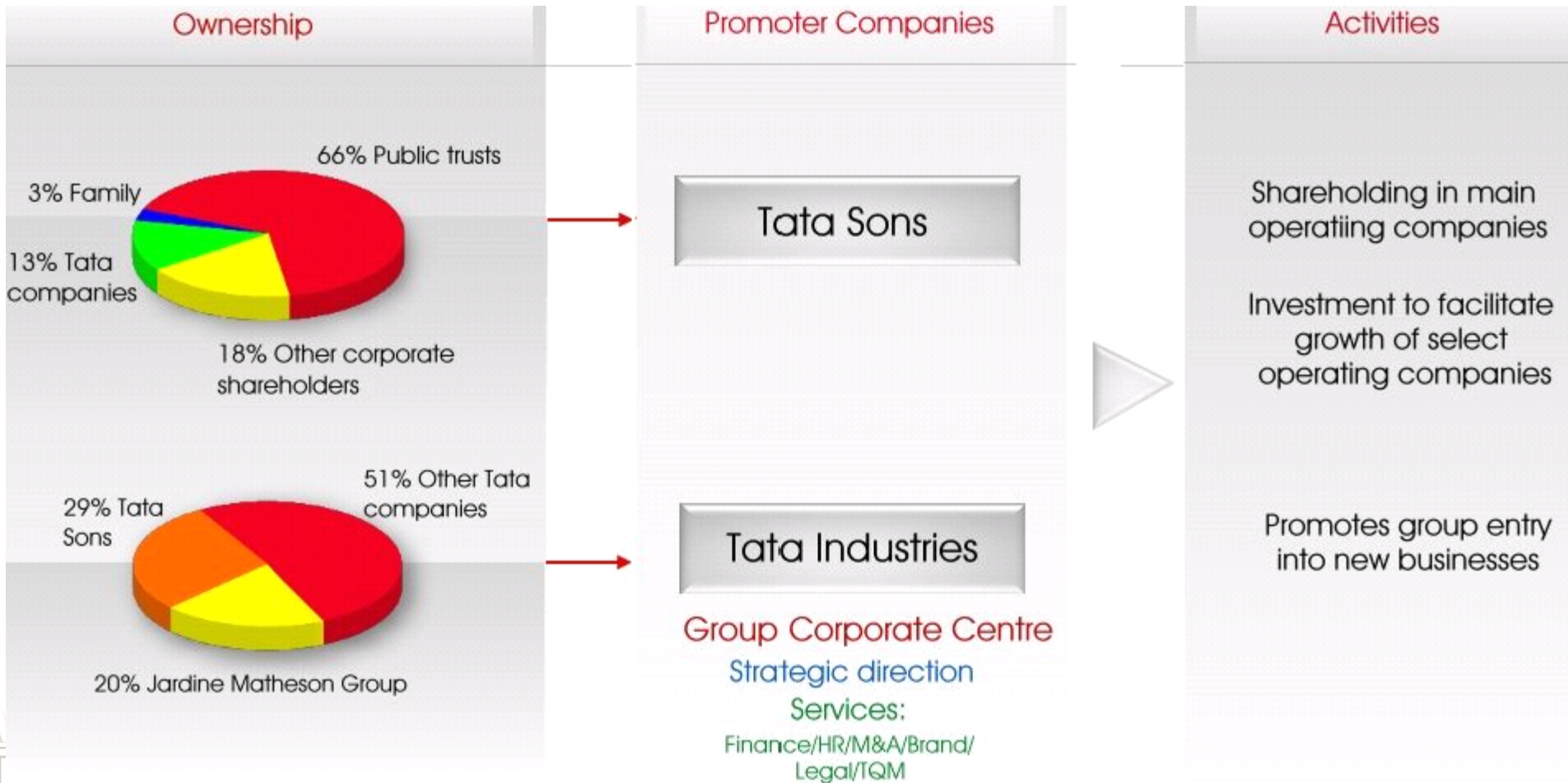

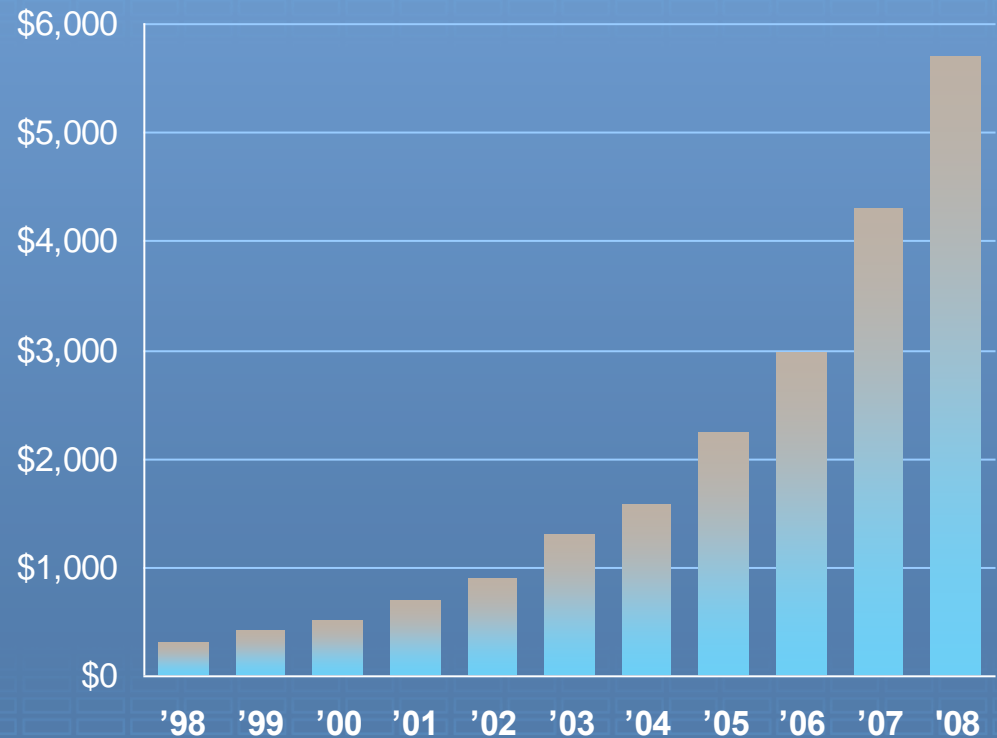

TCS Revenues in US\$ Millions



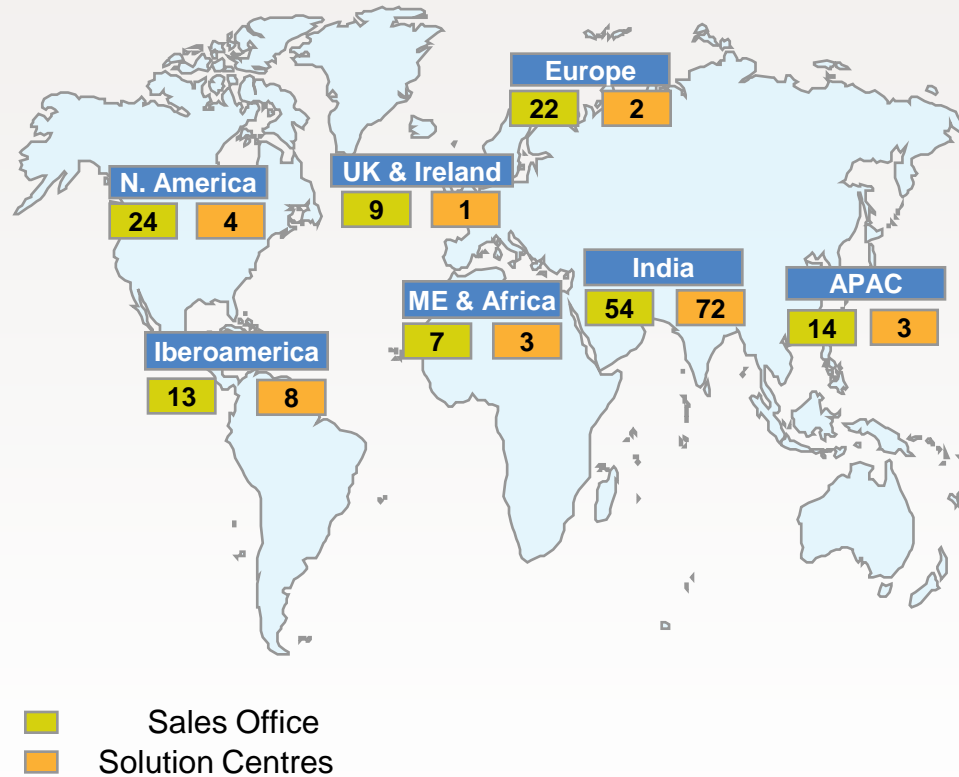

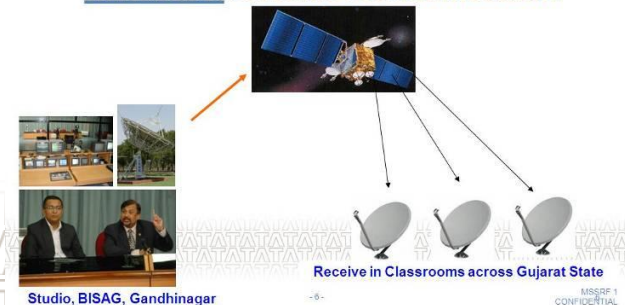

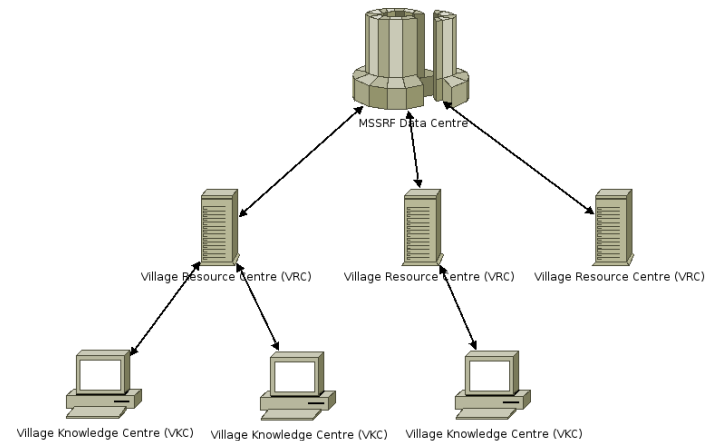

- Redefining the cell phone: from a mere voice device to a multi-function system
- Uses BREW applications on CMDA phones to provide vital information for farmers on issues like :
 - Micro region weather information and advice.
 - Advice on fertilizer and pesticide usage
 - Market information



This is the help main screen. It displays the geographical location of the farmer's handset. Thereafter the agricultural assistance information pertaining to his field is procured from the Village Knowledge Centre and displayed.

CHILDLINE

Using technology to enhance

In 2000-2001, a group from TCS' Java Excellence Centre designed the ChildNET Call receiving software and database for the 24-hour helpline run by CHILDLINE, an NGO for children in distress. The 54 centre project is still supported by TCS. Annual volume of calls received stood at 2 million in 2006.

Childline V.2 now involves a nationwide upscaling of the network with optimal service delivery, cost reduction, enhanced speed & mobile connectivity. TCS will also create a portal and upgrade the website.

CHILDLINE was initiated as an experimental project of TISS in 1996. Unique example of Govt-NGO cooperation.

- By making data available for public scrutiny, the portal facilitates the Right to Information Act.

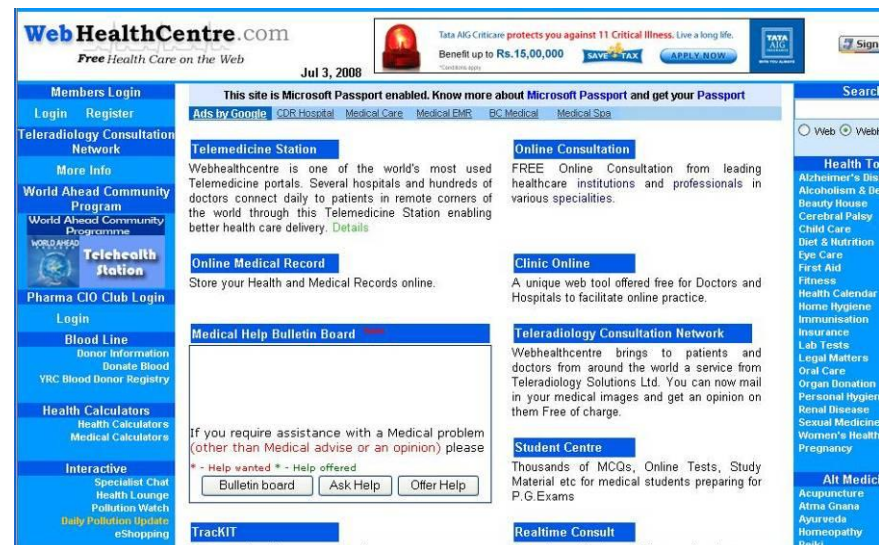
- A database of 44 lakh families in over 13,000 villages has been created

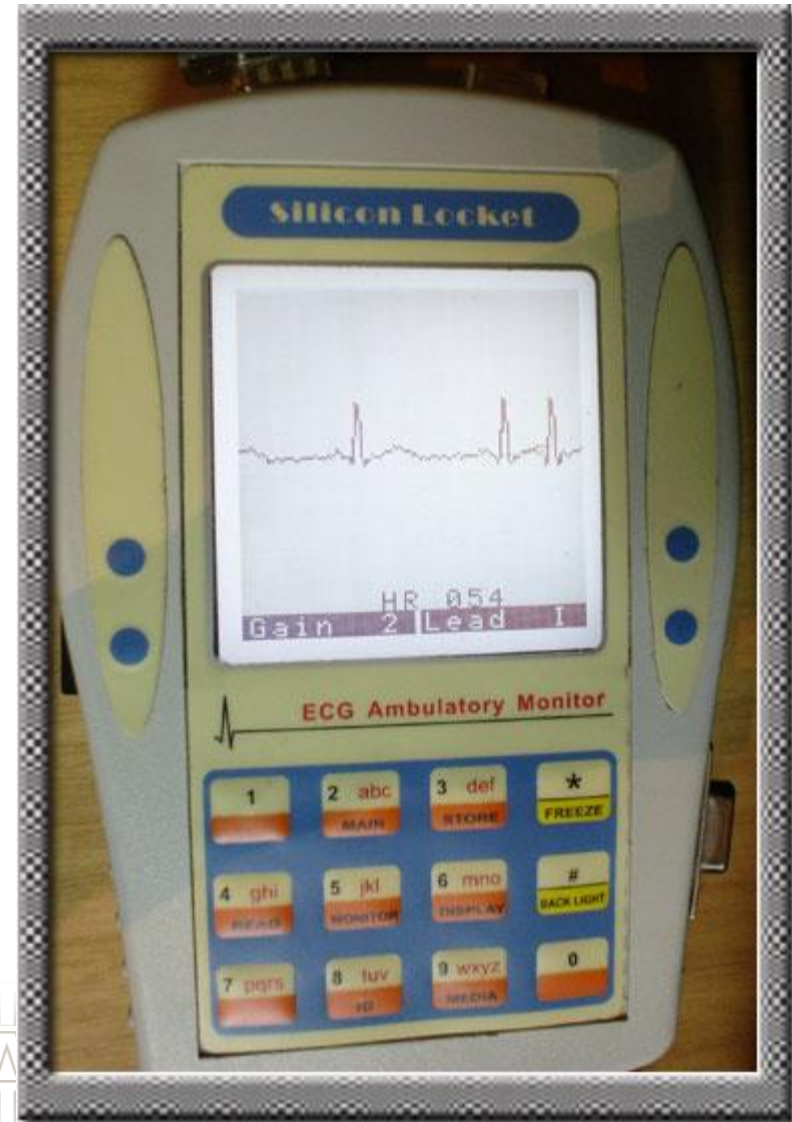

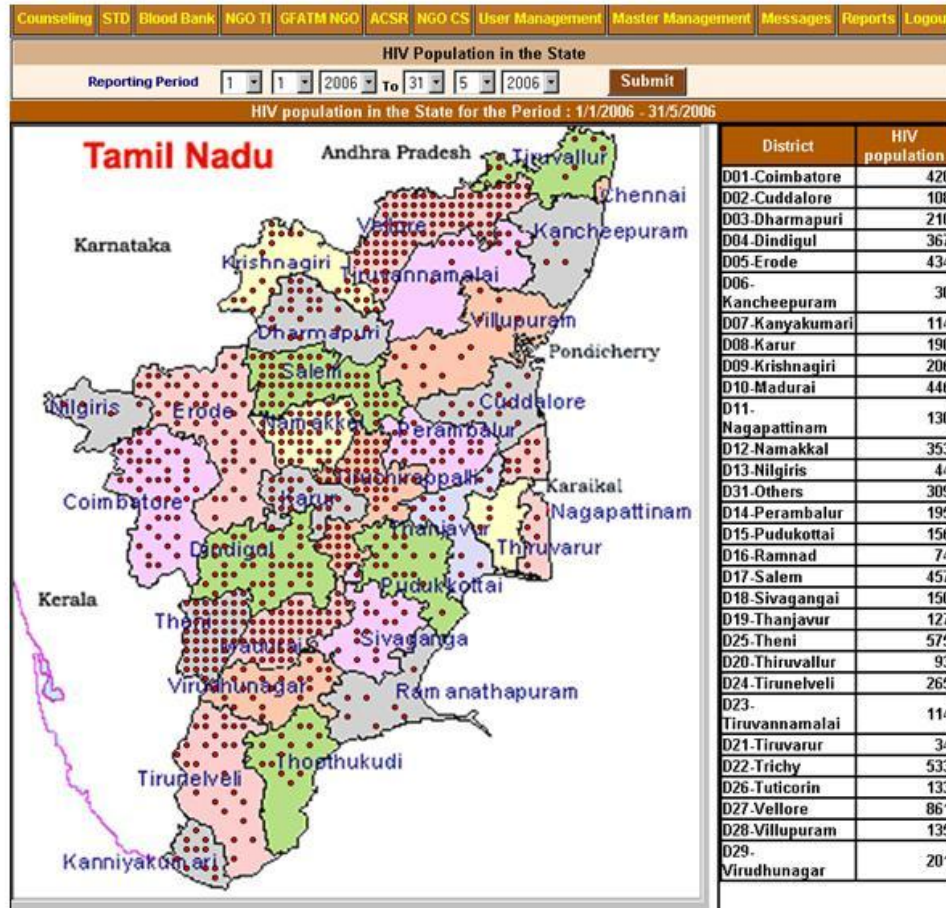

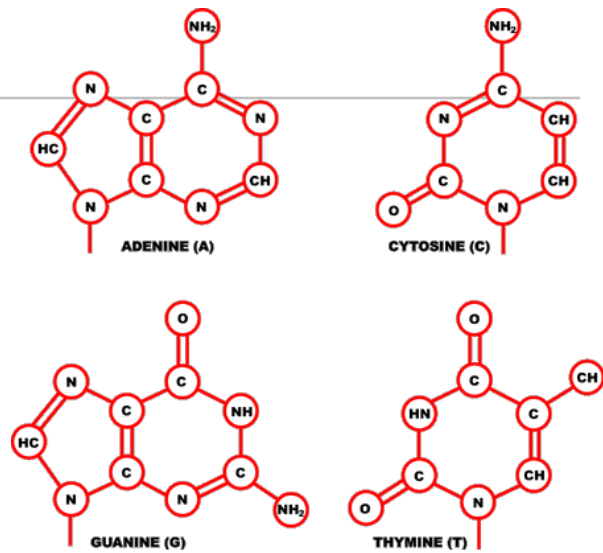


Web based MIS for Tamil Nadu AIDS Control Society

TCS has now undertaken a project to help protect the 100+ sq km Sanjay Gandhi National Park in Borivali, Mumbai. TCS is creating a decision support system integrating maps to help in the management of the Park resources and wealth.

Project Geo-Vun will help to check illegal encroachment, forest fires in and around the Park, enhance patrolling (beat) efficiency within the Park, prevent the illegal felling of trees, implement measures to prevent poaching and plundering of forest wealth, monitor & control the environment damage caused by mining activity near the park.

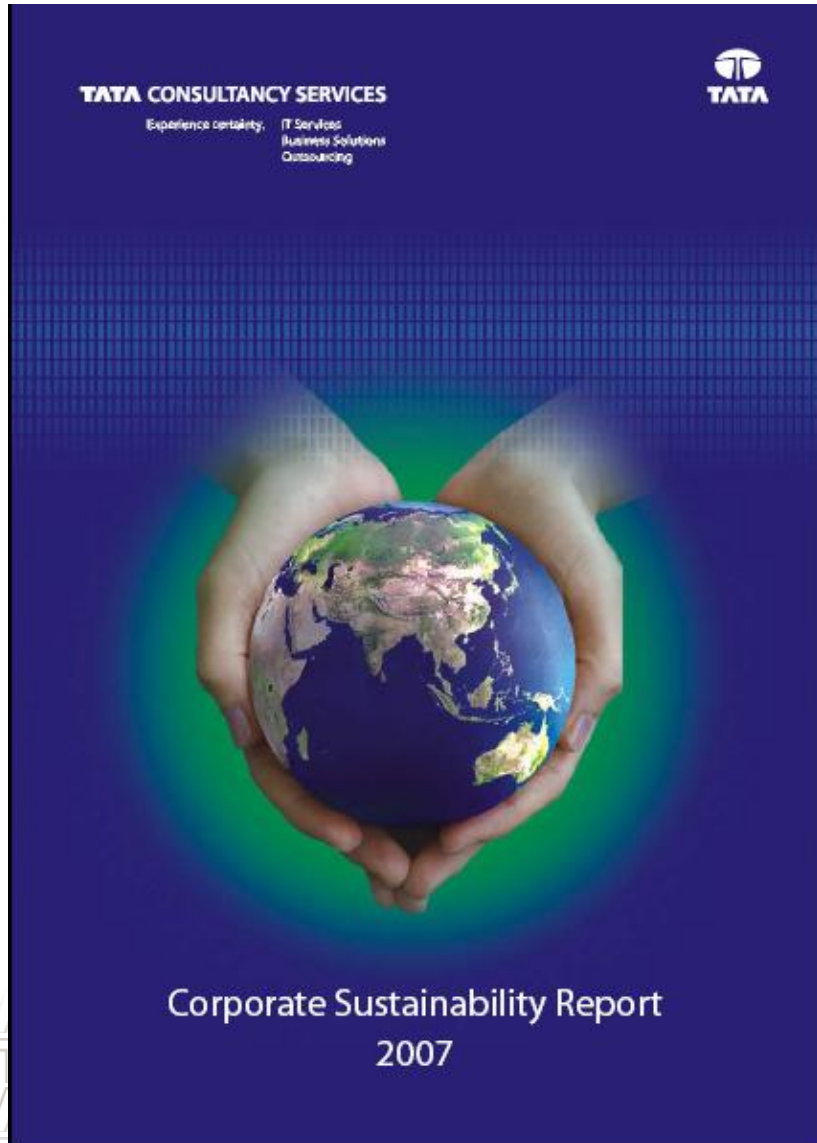
