

#### KARNATAKA: LOKSABHA ELECTIONS 2009

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE Date: May 18, 2009

**Bangalore:** National Election Watch1 (NEW), a nationwide campaign comprising of more than 1200 NGOs and other citizen led organizations, has been working on electoral reforms, improving democracy and governance in India.

This is a press release, prepared by NEW-Karmataka for results from the Karnataka Lok Sabha constituencies. NEW-Karnataka has looked at the affidavits of all the 28 declared winners from Karnataka.

### **Highlights**

- 1. Of the 28 LS constituencies in Karnataka, the BJP has won 19 seats, the INC 6, and JD(S) 3 seats. No Independent candidate has been elected to the LS.
- 2. Total number of winners with Criminal Records = 9 (i.e. 32% of 28 winning MPs), compared to 4 (i.e. 14% of 28 MPs) in 2004.
- 3. All political parties with winning candidates, have winners with criminal records: BJP has 6, JD(S) has 2 and INC has 1.
- 4. There are 8 criminal cases of serious nature on the winners. These include:,
  - Deliberate and malicious acts, intended to outrage religious feelings or any class by insulting its religion or religious beliefs
  - o Promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion, race, place of birth, residence, language, etc., and doing acts prejudicial to maintenance of harmony
  - o Voluntarily causing hurt by dangerous weapons or means
  - o Injuring or defiling place of worship with intent to insult the religion of any class
- 5. 25 of the MPs from Karnataka are Crorepathis. The MPs with less than 1 crore of declared assets are S. Parkirappa (Raichur), Nalin Kumar Kateel (Dakshin Kannada) and Ananthkumar Hegde (Uttar Kannada).
- 6. The average asset of the winners is 7.36 crores and average liabilities are 80 lakhs.
- 7. Three of the winners have not furnished their PANs.
- 8. Karnataka is represented by only 1 woman MP.
- 9. About 39.29% of winners are graduates, 14.29% are Post Graduates or Doctorates and 25% have completed only 12<sup>th</sup> standard education.



# Analysis of the criminal and financial backgrounds of the Karnataka MPs in the 15th Loksabha

#### General

BJP has won 19 seats, the INC 6, and JD(S) 3 seats. No Independent candidate has been elected to the LS. Of the 28 MPs, only 1 is a woman. About 39.29% of winners are graduates, 14.29% are Post Graduates or Doctorates and 25% have completed only 12<sup>th</sup> standard education.

#### MPs with criminal background

Total number of Karnataka MPs with criminal records is 9 (i.e. 32% of 28 winning MPs), compared to 4 (i.e. 14% of 28 MPs) in 2004.

## MPs with criminal charges (Party Wise)

At the national level, there are 150 (28.14%) newly elected MPs with criminal cases pending against them. The number of MPs with criminal records has gone up from 2004, when there were 128 MPs. So, both at the state and national level we see an increase in the number of MPs with a criminal backgrounds.

Number of MPs with serious cases also increase

There are 5 MPs (17.86%) from Karnataka with 8 criminal cases. The charges of serious nature include:

- o Deliberate and malicious acts, intended to outrage religious feelings or any class by insulting its religion or religious beliefs
- o Promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion, race, place of birth, residence, language, etc., and doing acts prejudicial to maintenance of harmony
- o Voluntarily causing hurt by dangerous weapons or means
- o Injuring or defiling place of worship with intent to insult the religion of any class

At the national level the number of MPs with serious criminal records is 72; up from 55 - a 30.9% increase.

## **Money Power of Winning Candidates**

25 of the 28 MPs from Karnataka are Crorepathis. At the party-level JD(S) has 3 MPs with average assets of 18 crores, BJP - 6 crores and Congress- 5 crores.

The Karnataka MP with the highest assets is H D Kumaraswamy (JD(S)) with declared assets of 48.47 crores. Shivakumar Channabasappa Udasi (BJP) is a close 2<sup>nd</sup> with 48.25 crores.

The MPs with less than 1 crore of declared assets are S. Parkirappa (Raichur), Nalin Kumar Kateel (Dakshin Kannada) and Ananthkumar Hegde (Uttar Kannada).

There are 300 crorepathi MPs in the new Lok Sabha. The maximum number 52, are from UP, followed by Maharashtra with 37, Andhra Pradesh with 31 and Karnataka with 25.

#### Matters of concern

The criminalization of politics continues to be a major concern, with an increase in the overall number of MPs, as well as those representing Karnataka in the 15<sup>th</sup> Loksabha. All three major parties in Karnataka have MPs with criminal charges of serious nature.

The entry of big money into politics is another issue. In a nation where a large number of people still live below the poverty line, it is ironical that we have 300 crorepathis in the Lok Sabha. In Karnataka, the average assets of the elected MPs is 7 crores and 25 of them are crorepathis; the average assets of the losers is 1.8 crores. In the 2004 elections, the average assets of the elected Karnataka MPs was 1.21 crores. This is a disturbing trend because it indicates that ordinary citizens have almost no chance of entering politics. Only the major parties win, and they give tickets to people with large assets.

As media reports seem to indicate, the misuse of monetary incentives to buy votes has increased sharply since 2008 and continues to be a source of threat to real democracy. While voter awareness on this issue is very high, the problem is that those who win after spending huge amounts are unlikely to focus on good governance. They are more likely to focus on recovering the funds they spent and on giving favours to those who supported their campaigns.
